Johannes Brahms (1833-1897) may be considered one of the greatest composers of all time, ranking in musical stature with Bach and Beethoven. He lived at a time when classical tradition had given way to musical picturization, the era of romanticism typified in the works of his contemporaries, Liszt and Wagner.

Brahms searched the past rather than the future for his inspiration which he found in the classics and the classical idiom, and, contrary to the musical trend of his time he built into the classical forms monuments of imperishable beauty and magnificence in both instrumental and vocal forms. Apropos of the latter, Brahms ranks with Schubert and Schumann as composer of *Lieder*.
